Target levels: Move 2 and above

Grammar: Quantifiers (too much, too many, not enough, enough)

Vocabulary: Disaster, lemonade, sticky, messy, lemons, sugar, water, salt, cups,

Functions: Talking and asking about quantity, expressing “too much/not enough,” learning cooperation and balance through humor

INTRODUCTION

C.S: Hello, boys and girls! Welcome back to *Easy English Stories*!

Echo (sounding weak): Hello, boys and girls... beep...

C.S: Echo? You don't sound very happy today. Are you okay?

Echo: No, I have a stomachache.

C.S: A stomachache? But Echo, you're a robot! Robots don't get stomachaches!

Echo: I ate too many French fries.

C.S: Too many fries! Yeah I remember. How many did you eat? I lost count after twenty.

Echo: Twenty-six. Maybe twenty-seven.

C.S: That's *too many* for sure!

Echo: And *too much* soda.

C.S: Well, now we know robots shouldn't eat *too much* or *too many* things!

Echo: *How much* medicine should I take?

C.S: Not *too much* ok?

Echo: Ok.

MAIN STORY: The Lemonade Disaster

C.S (narrating): It is a hot, sunny day.
Emma and her brother Tom are in the garden.
They want to make lemonade.

Echo: Oh! I love lemonade!

C.S: Emma says, "We need lemons."
Tom brings ten lemons.
"*Too many* lemons, Tom!" says Emma.
"We don't have *enough* sugar."

C.S: First, they put water in the jug.
Then, they put sugar in the jug.
And then, they put lemons in the jug.
But... Tom puts *too much* salt!

Echo: Oh no! *Too much* salt!

C.S: Emma tastes it.
She says, "Yuck! It's not sweet *enough*!"

Echo: Not sweet *enough*!

C.S: Tom says, "Let's add more sugar."
He adds sugar.
He adds more.
He adds *too much* sugar!

C.S: Now the lemonade is sticky and brown.
"It's *too sweet*!" says Emma.

Echo: Too sweet!

C.S: "It's not lemonade. It's a candy!"

C.S: They look at the big, messy table.
There is *too much* sugar, *too many* lemons, *too much* salt, and not *enough* cups.

Echo: Not *enough* cups!

C.S: Then their dad comes.

He smiles and says, "Look... You made a disaster, but you worked together. That is very important. And that's *enough* for today."

C.S: And everyone laughs.

They drink water instead.

C.S: Sometimes, too much or too little can be funny.

But *just enough* is perfect. And that's our story.

C.S: Now please repeat after us.

C.S: Too many Lemons.

Echo: Too many Lemons.

C.S: Too much salt!

Echo: Too much salt!

C.S: It is not sweet enough.

Echo: Not sweet enough.

C.S: It is too sweet.

Echo: too sweet.

C.s: There are not enough cups.

Echo: There are not enough cups.

CONCLUSION (Funny Q&A + Fun Fact)

C.S: Now Echo, I think it is questions time. I hope they are easy.
