Target Level: Move 3 and up

Grammar: *have / don't have* in the simple present

Vocabulary: lunch, bread, tomato, cheese, lettuce, ketchup, sandwich, friends

Functions: Talking about what you have/don't have; offering help; cooperating with others; understanding a short narrative story

INTRODUCTION

C.S.: Hello, boys and girls! I'm Captain Story, and this is my podcast.

Echo: It is OUR podcast.

C.S.: Eh, yes, it's *our* podcast.

Echo: Captain Story! Can I ask a question?

C.S.: Sure, Echo. What is it?

Echo: Do we have a good story *this time*?

C.S.: Of course we do. Wait a minute! What do you mean *this time*?

Echo: Nothing.

C.S.: Echo!

MAIN STORY: A Lunch for Friends

C.S.: It's noon at school.

The children are hungry.

Sam opens his bag.

"Oh, no!" says Sam. "I don't have lunch."

Echo: I don't have lunch.

C.S.: All the children have lunch.

Sam says, "I have nothing."

C.S.: Mia says, "Don't worry, Sam! I have bread."
Now, two pieces of bread are on the table.

C.S.: His friend Tom looks in his bag.
He says, "Hey, I have a tomato."

Now, the tomato is on the bread.

C.S.: Tom looks in his bag again.
"Oh, no! I don't have cheese," he says.

Echo: I don't have cheese.

C.S.: Bob is listening.
He says, "It's OK. I have cheese!"
He smiles and puts the cheese on the tomato.

C.S.: Tom says, "I have ketchup."
And puts some ketchup on top.
Then he says, "But I don't have lettuce."

C.S.: Anna says, "I have lettuce!"
She puts the lettuce on the sandwich.

C.S.: Sam looks at the table.
Now he has a *big* sandwich.
He smiles and says,
"Thank you! Now I have lunch... and I have very good friends."

PRACTICE

C.S.: Please repeat after us!

C.S.: I have bread.
Echo: I have bread.

C.S.: I have a tomato.
Echo: I have a tomato.

C.S.: I don't have cheese.
Echo: I don't have cheese.

C.S.: I have good friends.

Echo: I have good friends.

Q&A + Fun Fact

C.S.: Ok. Now it's time for me to answer your questions. Ask away, please.

Child 1: Captain Story, why is the sky blue?

C.S.: Because blue is light and it goes up. Green and brown are heavy and they come down.

Child 2: Captain Story, why do birds sing in the morning?

C.S.: Well... I think the trees fall asleep and forget their leaves.

Child 3: Captain Story, why do leaves fall in the fall?

C.S.: Because the trees fall asleep and let go of their hands.

C.S.: And now, boys and girls, let's listen to Echo's fun fact.

Echo: Did you know that an octopus has three hearts?

C.S.: Three hearts! Wow! I think they must be very kind!

Echo: Yes! And did you know that the shark has no bones?

C.S.: Really? No bones at all?

Echo: That's right.

C.S.: Well, thank you for listening, boys and girls. Join us next week for another Easy English Story!
